AN EXPLANATION...

Psalm 119:97 "O how love I thy law! It is my meditation all the day."

The purpose of the Top Priority devotional manual is to help you make the Lord your top priority in life. This is done by providing you with a daily devotional plan through which you meet with the Lord and get daily direction for your life.

Top Priority consists of two sections: 1) The daily Probe section arranged by months. Here you will find daily passages to be read and the question for each day that you are to answer. 2) The daily devotional form where you will record your daily devotional responses.

Each day you will probe—read the question and the passage assigned. You will then ponder the passage (meditate) and record your answer to the probe. Finally, you will apply the truth learned by writing out how you plan to personalize it in your life that day. For example...

Friday	/:	Date	January	2,	2002

Probe: What can I learn from an ant? Proverbs 6:1-11 (Question and passage for the date)

Ponder: How does the passage answer the question? The ant does not have a supervisor. No one tells him what to do or when to do it, but he works daily to fill his storehouse in preparation for the winter. He doesn't waste his time by always sleeping.

Personalize: How can I apply this passage to my life? I should finish the job without someone always telling me to do it. To store up spiritual knowledge, I must meditate and memorize daily to fill my memory bank for future trials in the winter.

Or

As the ant feasts in the winter on his summer's labor, I will feast only if I have filled my mind with Scripture—the milk and meat of God's Word.
