All these world philosophies are man-centered. None of them look beyond man for his salvation. Of course the Bible is the only source that can give us the truth about salvation.


## God's Truth About Salvation

# Christ <u>Provided The Way</u> Of Salvation Through His Death, Burial, And Resurrection (Romans 5:6-8)

The key word in salvation is <u>substitution</u>. We are condemned, guilty sinners. We must pay for our sins by dying and going to hell. There is no escape. However, God will accept a substitute—that is, someone else may take our place!

However, the substitute must meet three criteria:

- He must be <u>innocent</u> of sin.
- He must be <u>human</u>
- He must be <u>willing</u>.
