ProTeens is a ministry of Positive Action For Christ and is a non–profit corporation whose main emphasis is educating and equipping local churches to produce laborers for the harvest. Positive Action For Christ began as a single ProTeen club at the Falls Road Baptist Church in Rocky Mount, North Carolina in the fall of 1969. Under the direction of Rev. Frank Hamrick, then Associate Pastor at Falls Road Baptist Church and founder of the ProTeen program, it spread to other churches.

What is ProTeens?

The word ProTeens is rich with meaning. First, it stands for "Project Teenagers." The name is also a play—on—words. As proteins are essential to life and health, so ProTeens gives youth the essentials to build a strong, healthy spiritual life. The word "Pro" stands for two things—both of which also apply to ProTeens.

First, "pro" is short for "professional." We use the word in sports to indicate one who is not an amateur but is advanced and proficient. ProTeens likewise produces teens who are "pros" in the Lord's service. Further, "pro" is a prefix meaning "for" rather than "anti" (against). Thus, ProTeens means we are "FOR teens" not against them.

Three separate programs carry the name ProTeens: Classic, Sigma, and Delta Force. Classic is the original ProTeen program. In the yellow/red format, it is a more advanced program for teens who want a greater challenge. Sigma is an exciting evangelistic program designed for every teen in the youth group. Delta Force is similar to Classic with an emphasis on leadership development. Together, these programs form the composite ProTeen Bible club. Note: Some churches use a combination of these three programs. Each of these combinations, however, goes by the trademark "ProTeens."

This handbook describes the Classic format. The very fact that you are getting involved in ProTeens Classic is a testimony to the fact that you are ready to accept the challenge of more! Thousands of teens around the world join with you this year in the exciting project of becoming a quality Christian teen.

A quality program is imperative, for these young people have the awesome task of leading the next generation's churches and evangelizing the lost. Thousands of teens are searching for truth today. They are looking for the real thing. Therefore, the great need of this age is to have an army of trained, equipped, and burdened youth in active service reaching other teens with the gospel of Christ.

ProTeens Classic has been designed to meet this need. It offers youth the training and opportunity so desperately needed for effective evangelism. With this kind of program, churches can send forth their teens proudly, knowing they have given them a thorough knowledge of the Scriptures. Through the evangelistic projects of your ProTeens Classic club, you will have the privilege of seeing many of your unsaved acquaintances trust Christ as their Lord and Savior. Then, invite them to your regular Classic meeting in order that they might be built up in the Word of God.

Your ProTeen program has been designed to mature saved teens for the work of the ministry (Ephesians 4:12). Through a solid program of Bible study, daily devotions, Scripture memory, Practical Christian Work assignments, and extra reading, ProTeens offers you a chance to "grow in grace and in the knowledge" of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Teens need to know the Word in order to live and give the Word to others. It is for these reasons that ProTeens offers a six–year, in–depth Bible study for those teens who really want to be used of the Lord.

The ProTeen program is available in several scoring levels ("colors"). Your youth pastor will explain the "color" you will be using. In this handbook, all references to "Level One" apply to all teens in "White" scoring level clubs and to 7th–8th grade teens in "Yellow/Red" scoring level clubs. All references to Level Two apply only to 9th–12th grade teens in "Yellow/Red" clubs.

Weekly Bible Study

Once a week, you will have the opportunity to attend a ProTeen Bible study. At this meeting, the director will teach a lesson in the Bible study series for the year.

You will receive a student manual for notes from the teacher's lesson and for weekly student's lessons. If you are using the "White" scoring level, you will be quizzed the following week on the material from the teacher's lesson and the student's Level One at–home Bible study. If you are using the "Yellow/Red" scoring level, you will be quizzed on the teacher's material and the at–home Bible study (7th–8th grade teens will complete the Level One

at-home Bible study and 9th-12 grade teens will complete the Level One and Level Two at-home Bible study).

Daily Devotions

ProTeens has two daily devotional programs called Top Priority and Book of Remembrance. The Top Priority manual contains forty weeks of devotions. The Book of Remembrance contains enough inserts for an entire year. You will receive five (5) points each day you complete your devotions.

However, we realize that everyone's tastes are not the same. It was for this reason that we designed both devotional formats so that you could use them with another devotional (still filling in what you learned). Also, some of you may find it exciting to choose your own devotional program. Whatever way you choose to have your devotions, remember, the important thing is that as you have them, you grow closer to the Lord.

Scripture Memory Course

This student's handbook contains your entire Scripture Memory Course for this year. These verses are to be memorized and quoted by passage. A passage is made up of five (5) verses in Level One (and "White" clubs) and ten (10) verses in Level Two. You will receive twenty–five (25) points per passage quoted in Level One and fifty (50) points per passage in Level Two.

There are a total of 120 verses for Level One teens and 180 verses for Level Two teens. You must quote a minimum of one passage per sitting in both levels. Level One teens are to quote no more than six (6) passages per month, and Level Two no more than four (4) passages per month.

Thus, a Level One teen can complete his entire Scripture memory program in four months! A Level Two teen, quoting the maximum each month, will need five months to complete the entire program. This allows teens to go slower if they desire, and it allows those of you who start late to catch up with the leaders.

Practical Christian Work

When you complete a Practical Christian Work assignment, you will be given twenty–five (25) points in "Yellow/Red" clubs and fifty (50) points in "White" clubs. No more than two assignments per month will count for points. The second assignment must be different from the first in order to count. At the end of each month, your ProTeen director will ask you to name the PCW assignments you completed. The following are suggested assign-

ments. Your ProTeen director may make a few changes which you should note on this page.

- Rest home services.
- Jail services.
- Tract distribution. At least five tracts have to be given personally to the lost.
- Hospital visitation. At least two people must be visited, and the patients must be someone other than those in the immediate family.
- Teaching a Sunday school or Wednesday night class.
- Singing in a special musical group in a church–related activity. The ProTeen director must approve of the group. Solos, duets, musical instruments, etc., will count.
- Giving a prepared testimony at a youth rally or church service. "Popcorn" type testimonies in a testimony service do not count.
- Visiting a shut–in. The shut–in must be someone other than those in the immediate family.
- Witnessing (with Bible, and going through the plan of salvation) to an unsaved person.

Such things as passing out bulletins, helping to clean up the church, keeping the church library, etc., will not count as a PCW assignment.

Reading Christian Books

ProTeens offers you the opportunity to read good Christian literature and gives you credit for doing so. Your ProTeen director will give you a list of approved books from which you may choose the ones you would like to read. The books are divided according to categories such as Christian Living, Biography, Missionary, etc. Both levels receive thirty (30) points for each book read. However, in ISC Level One teens only receive credit for five (5) books per year and Level Two teens ten (10) books per year. Also in ISC, only one novel counts as a book read. You must fill out a book report form for each book read.

Visitors

Encourage unsaved teens to go with you to ProTeen Recreation. They will have both a good time and an opportunity to hear the gospel.

You will also receive credit for the visitors you bring to the ProTeen meeting.

Churches may or may not place a limit on the number of times a teen may bring the same visitor. Check with your director. Most churches allow a teen to bring the person only three times for points. Each visitor counts ten (10) points.

Sermon Outlines

Sermon outlines may be required by your youth leaders for Level Two teens. If so, they normally count 10 points per week. Some clubs also require Sermon outlines for Level One teens. If your club scores points for Sermon outlines, you will be given a form to fill out. Complete this form as you listen to your pastor and turn in the outlines of the pastor's sermons to your leader.

Two-Way Competition

Through this unique program, ProTeens offers you two types of competition: 1) Local Scoring Competition; and 2) International Scoring Competition ("Yellow/Red" clubs only)

The Local Scoring Competition

The Ranking System

ProTeens utilizes a ranking and awards system as a guide to measure your progress and to provide an extra incentive to keep you going. The following ranking system is used.

All new members have the dubious distinction of becoming a Recruit. They should wear the Recruit button to each Bible study and Extravaganza.

- Recruits become Rookies when they have earned 1000 points.
- Rookies become Regulars when they have earned 2000 points.
- Regulars become Pros when they have earned a total of 3000 points. Many clubs award gifts for this achievement.

Your rank is based on points scored in the Local Scoring Competition.

Special Recruit Rules

- The Recruit button must be worn in plain view to count as being worn.
- The Recruit button will give the Recruit 10 bonus points for each ProTeen meeting attended.
- The Recruit may wear the Recruit button to any school function (i.e., ball game, gym, to and from school, etc.) for a bonus of 10

- points. Note: No more than 10 points per week may be earned by this method.
- When a teen scores 1000 points, he becomes a Rookie and is immune to all Recruit rules.

Uh Oh!!!

At the end of nine months of scoring (September through May), each person loses all his points and must begin the next year with zero points again! However, each person retains the rank from the previous year. For example, John Doe was a Rookie with 1940 points at the end of May. The next September he would still be classed as a Rookie, but he would lose all his points and begin at zero again. He will remain a Rookie until he gets 2000 points in a nine—month period.

Shirts

Recruits, Rookies, Regulars, and Pros may purchase and wear ProTeen shirts. Each time you wear a ProTeen shirt to recreation you earn 15 points.

How To Score Points

The Local Scoring Competition is a race between every member of your club to see who can score the most points in a single nine—month period. Basically, your Local Scoring Competition follows the point structure and rules for the International Scoring Competition (explained later), but your director may change the system, allowing you to score bonus points in your club. Your director may be planning a ProTeen Awards Banquet at the end of the year to honor your achievement. Our exhortation to you is, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15).

ProTeen Attendance Slip

On Orientation Day your director will explain the ProTeen Attendance Slip to you. At each meeting thereafter, you should fill in the Attendance Slip at the beginning of your ProTeen meeting.

International Scoring Competition Yellow and Red Clubs Only

Positive Action For Christ offers clubs, at the "Yellow/Red" scoring level, the privilege of competing with other teens in ProTeen clubs around the world through the International Scoring Competition (ISC). If you would like to enter ISC, read through the point potentials and rules for your level on the next few pages. Then, speak to your director about signing up for this exciting program. The International Scoring Competition sign—up sheet must be mailed by October 15, so if you intend to sign up, you need to do it right away.

Level One and Level Two International Scoring Rules

Attendance At Sunday School

You receive fifteen (15) points for attendance at Sunday school the Sunday preceding the ProTeen meeting. Never give yourself credit for the coming

Sunday. For International Scoring, credit may be given for no more than twenty–five (25) Sundays.

Attendance At The ProTeen Meeting

You receive thirty (30) points for attendance at each ProTeen meeting, with a maximum of twenty–five (25) meetings counting for International Scoring.

ProTeen Shirts

You are given fifteen (15) points for wearing any ProTeen shirt to recreation. The shirts may be counted for a maximum of ten (10) times in International Scoring.

Visitors Brought To The ProTeen Meeting Or Recreation

A visitor is a teen that does not attend ProTeens.

In International Scoring you receive no more than fifty (50) total points for Level One and one hundred (100) total points for Level Two for ProTeen visitors during each nine—month ProTeen year.

A visitor counts ten (10) points and may be counted for three visits only. Visitors may be brought for credit to either the meeting or recreation (i.e., they may count for either, but not both, if held the same night).

Devotions

You receive five (5) points for each day you complete your devotions. A maximum of two hundred (200) days will count for International Scoring.

Practical Christian Work Assignments (PCWs)

When you complete a Practical Christian Work assignment, you will be given twenty–five (25) points. No more than two assignments per month will count for points.

IMPORTANT! The second assignment must be different from the first assignment in order to get the additional twenty–five (25) points.

Christian Books

You receive a score of thirty (30) points for each Christian book read. In International Scoring you will not get credit for more than five (5) books in Level One and ten (10) books in Level Two. Books containing 50–124 pages count as one–half book and are worth fifteen (15) points. Books containing 125–249 pages count as one full book and are worth thirty (30) points. Books

containing 250–349 pages count as two full books and are worth sixty (60) points. Books containing 350 or more pages count as three full books and are worth ninety (90) points. Only one novel will count for ISC. You must fill out a book report form on each book read.

Scripture Memory

You will receive twenty—five (25) points per passage quoted in Level One and fifty (50) points per passage in Level Two. In Level One five (5) verses make up a passage, and in Level Two ten (10) verses make up a passage. There are a total of 120 verses in Level One and 180 verses in Level Two. You must quote a minimum of one passage per sitting not to exceed six (6) passages per month in Level One and four (4) passages per month in Level Two. Level One teens can complete the entire Scripture Memory Course in four months, and Level Two teens can finish in five months. Thus, if you get started late, or get behind, you can catch up during the last months of the year. Don't use this, however, as an excuse to slide during the first months of the year. Most teens prefer to get ahead early, so that their Scripture memory is done before spring and all the activities at the end of a school year.

Sermon Outlines

Sermon outlines are not required for International Scoring.

Quizzes

A weekly written quiz will be given over both the teacher's lesson and the student's lesson. Level One quiz points will total 175 and Level Two 375 for the year.

Theme

Teens in International Scoring will be required to write a 1,000 (Level One) or 1,500 (Level Two) word theme for a potential total of 300 points for Level One and 100 points for Level Two. These themes will be graded by Positive Action For Christ, and the results will be added to the teen's final score. The themes will be on a subject to be announced and must be mailed to the Positive Action For Christ office postmarked no later than April 30.

A rough draft written by the teen must accompany the theme. All notations used in writing the theme must be included in the material. (The purpose for this is to see that the manuscript is the original work of the writer.)

The grade for each theme will be kept secret until the names of the International Scoring Champions are announced at The Wilds Christian Camp in July.

Genesis 4:1-10

- 1 And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD.
- 2 And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground.
- And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD.
- 4 And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. And the LORD had respect unto Abel and to his offering:
- 5 But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.
- 6 And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen?

- 3 And his master saw that the LORD was with him, and that the LORD made all that he did to prosper in his hand.
- 4 And Joseph found grace in his sight, and he served him: and he made him overseer over his house, and all that he had he put into his hand.
- And it came to pass from the time that he had made him overseer in his house, and over all that he had, that the LORD blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; and the blessing of the LORD was upon all that he had in the house, and in the field.

Genesis 39:11-15; Exodus 2:1-5

- 39:11 And it came to pass about this time, that Joseph went into the house to do his business; and there was none of the men of the house there within.
- 12 And she caught him by his garment, saying, Lie with me: and he left his garment in her hand, and fled, and got him out.
- 13 And it came to pass, when she saw that he had left his garment in her hand, and was fled forth,
- 14 That she called unto the men of her house, and spake unto them, saying, See, he hath brought in an Hebrew unto us to mock us; he came in unto me to lie with me, and I cried with a loud voice:
- 15 And it came to pass, when he heard that I lifted up my voice and cried, that he left his garment with me, and fled, and got him out.
- 2:1 And there went a man of the house of Levi, and took to wife a daughter of Levi.
- 2 And the woman conceived, and bare a son: and when she saw him that he was a goodly child, she hid him three months.
- 3 And when she could not longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bulrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch, and put the child therein; and she laid it in the flags by the river's brink.
- 4 And his sister stood afar off, to wit what would be done to him.
- 5 And the daughter of Pharaoh came down to wash herself at the river; and her maidens walked along by the river's side; and when she saw the ark among the flags, she sent her maid to fetch it.

Exodus 2:6-15

- 6 And when she had opened it, she saw the child: and, behold, the babe wept. And she had compassion on him, and said, This is one of the Hebrews' children.
- 7 Then said his sister to Pharaoh's daughter, Shall I go and call to thee a nurse of the Hebrew women, that she may nurse the child for thee?
- 8 And Pharaoh's daughter said to her, Go. And the maid went and called the child's mother.
- 9 And Pharaoh's daughter said unto her, Take this child away, and nurse it for me, and I will give thee thy wages. And the woman took the child, and nursed it.

- 14 And he said, Who made thee a prince and a judge over us? intendest thou to kill me, as thou killedst the Egyptian? And Moses feared, and said, Surely this thing is known.
- 15 Now when Pharaoh heard this thing, he sought to slay Moses. But Moses fled from the face of Pharaoh, and dwelt in the land of Midian: and he sat down by a well

Exodus 6:1-10

- 6:1 Then the LORD said unto Moses, Now shalt thou see what I will do to Pharaoh: for with a strong hand shall he let them go, and with a strong hand shall he drive them out of his land.
- And God spake unto Moses, and said unto him, I am the LORD:
- And I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my name JEHOVAH was I not known to them.
- 4 And I have also established my covenant with them, to give them the land of Canaan, the land of their pilgrimage, wherein they were strangers.
- And I have also heard the groaning of the children of Israel, whom the Egyptians keep in bondage; and I have remembered my covenant.
- Wherefore say unto the children of Israel, I am the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will rid you out of their bondage, and I will redeem you with a stretched out arm, and with great judgments:
- And I will take you to me for a people, and I will be to you a God: and ye shall know that I am the LORD your God, which bringeth you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians.
- 8 And I will bring you in unto the land, concerning the which I did swear to give it to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob; and I will give it you for an heritage: I am the LORD.
- 9 And Moses spake so unto the children of Israel: but they hearkened not unto Moses for anguish of spirit, and for cruel bondage.
- 10 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

Exodus 6:11-13; 32:9-15

- 6:11Go in, speak unto Pharaoh king of Egypt, that he let the children of Israel go out of his land.
- 12 And Moses spake before the LORD, saying, Behold, the children of Israel have not hearkened unto me; how then shall Pharaoh hear me, who am of uncircumcised lips?
- 13 And the LORD spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, and gave them a charge unto the children of Israel, and unto Pharaoh king of Egypt, to bring the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt.

- 32:9And the LORD said unto Moses, I have seen this people, and, behold, it is a stiffnecked people:
- 10 Now therefore let me alone, that my wrath may wax hot against them, and that I may consume them: and I will make of thee a great nation.
- 11 And Moses besought the LORD his God, and said, LORD, why doth thy wrath wax hot against thy people, which thou hast brought forth out of the land of Egypt with great power, and with a mighty hand?
- 12 Wherefore should the Egyptians speak, and say, For mischief did he bring them out, to slay them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth? Turn from thy fierce wrath, and repent of this evil against thy people.
- 13 Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, thy servants, to whom thou swarest by thine own self, and saidst unto them, I will multiply your seed as the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have spoken of will I give unto your seed, and they shall inherit it for ever.
- 14 And the LORD repented of the evil which he thought to do unto his people.
- 15 And Moses turned, and went down from the mount, and the two tables of the testimony were in his hand: the tables were written on both their sides; on the one side and on the other were they written.

Deuteronomy 34:4-12; Joshua 1:1

- 34:4And the LORD said unto him, This is the land which I sware unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, saying, I will give it unto thy seed: I have caused thee to see it with thine eyes, but thou shalt not go over thither.
- 5 So Moses the servant of the LORD died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the LORD.
- 6 And he buried him in a valley in the land of Moab, over against Beth-peor: but no man knoweth of his sepulchre unto this day.
- 7 And Moses was an hundred and twenty years old when he died: his eye was not dim, nor his natural force abated.
- And the children of Israel wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days: so the days of weeping and mourning for Moses were ended.
- And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom; for Moses had laid his hands upon him: and the children of Israel hearkened unto him, and did as the LORD commanded Moses.
- 10 And there arose not a prophet since in Israel like unto Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face.
- 11 In all the signs and the wonders, which the LORD sent him to do in the land of Egypt to Pharaoh, and to all his servants, and to all his land,
- 12 And in all that mighty hand, and in all the great terror which Moses shewed in the sight of all Israel.
- 1:1 Now after the death of Moses the servant of the LORD it came to pass, that the LORD spake unto Joshua the son of Nun, Moses' minister, saying,

Joshua 1:2-11

- 2 Moses my servant is dead; now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, thou, and all this people, unto the land which I do give to them, even to the children of Israel
- 3 Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you, as I said unto Moses.

- 4 From the wilderness and this Lebanon even unto the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, and unto the great sea toward the going down of the sun, shall be your coast.
- There shall not any man be able to stand before thee all the days of thy life: as I was with Moses, so I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee.
- Be strong and of a good courage: for unto this people shalt thou divide for an inheritance the land, which I sware unto their fathers to give them.
- 7 Only be thou strong and very courageous, that thou mayest observe to do according to all the law, which Moses my servant commanded thee: turn not from it to the right hand or to the left, that thou mayest prosper whithersoever thou goest.
- 8 This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.
- 9 Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.
- 10 Then Joshua commanded the officers of the people, saying,
- 11 Pass through the host, and command the people, saying, Prepare you victuals; for within three days ye shall pass over this Jordan, to go in to possess the land, which the LORD your God giveth you to possess it.

Joshua 23:2-11

- 2 And Joshua called for all Israel, and for their elders, and for their heads, and for their judges, and for their officers, and said unto them, I am old and stricken in age:
- 3 And ye have seen all that the LORD your God hath done unto all these nations because of you; for the LORD your God is he that hath fought for you.
- 4 Behold, I have divided unto you by lot these nations that remain, to be an inheritance for your tribes, from Jordan, with all the nations that I have cut off, even unto the great sea westward.
- And the LORD your God, he shall expel them from before you, and drive them from out of your sight; and ye shall possess their land, as the LORD your God hath promised unto you.
- 6 Be ye therefore very courageous to keep and to do all that is written in the book of the law of Moses, that ye turn not aside therefrom to the right hand or to the left:
- 7 That ye come not among these nations, these that remain among you; neither make mention of the name of their gods, nor cause to swear by them, neither serve them, nor bow yourselves unto them:
- 8 But cleave unto the LORD your God, as ye have done unto this day.
- 9 For the LORD hath driven out from before you great nations and strong: but as for you, no man hath been able to stand before you unto this day.
- 10 One man of you shall chase a thousand: for the LORD your God, he it is that fighteth for you, as he hath promised you.
- 11 Take good heed therefore unto yourselves, that ye love the LORD your God.

Acts 7:2-11

- 2 And he said, Men, brethren, and fathers, hearken; The God of glory appeared unto our father Abraham, when he was in Mesopotamia, before he dwelt in Charran,
- 3 And said unto him, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and come into the land which I shall shew thee.
- 4 Then came he out of the land of the Chaldaeans, and dwelt in Charran: and from thence, when his father was dead, he removed him into this land, wherein ye now dwell.
- And he gave him none inheritance in it, no, not so much as to set his foot on: yet he promised that he would give it to him for a possession, and to his seed after him, when as yet he had no child.
- 6 And God spake on this wise, That his seed should sojourn in a strange land; and that they should bring them into bondage, and entreat them evil four hundred years.
- 7 And the nation to whom they shall be in bondage will I judge, said God: and after that shall they come forth, and serve me in this place.
- 8 And he gave him the covenant of circumcision: and so Abraham begat Isaac, and circumcised him the eighth day; and Isaac begat Jacob; and Jacob begat the twelve patriarchs.
- 9 And the patriarchs, moved with envy, sold Joseph into Egypt: but God was with him
- 10 And delivered him out of all his afflictions, and gave him favour and wisdom in the sight of Pharaoh king of Egypt; and he made him governor over Egypt and all his house.
- 11 Now there came a dearth over all the land of Egypt and Chanaan, and great affliction: and our fathers found no sustenance.

Acts 7:12-21

- 12 But when Jacob heard that there was corn in Egypt, he sent out our fathers first.
- 13 And at the second time Joseph was made known to his brethren; and Joseph's kindred was made known unto Pharaoh.
- 14 Then sent Joseph, and called his father Jacob to him, and all his kindred, threescore and fifteen souls.
- 15 So Jacob went down into Egypt, and died, he, and our fathers,
- 16 And were carried over into Sychem, and laid in the sepulchre that Abraham bought for a sum of money of the sons of Emmor the father of Sychem.
- 17 But when the time of the promise drew nigh, which God had sworn to Abraham, the people grew and multiplied in Egypt,
- 18 Till another king arose, which knew not Joseph.
- 19 The same dealt subtilly with our kindred, and evil entreated our fathers, so that they cast out their young children, to the end they might not live.
- 20 In which time Moses was born, and was exceeding fair, and nourished up in his father's house three months:
- 21 And when he was cast out, Pharaoh's daughter took him up, and nourished him for her own son.

Acts 7:22-31

- 22 And Moses was learned in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and was mighty in words and in deeds.
- 23 And when he was full forty years old, it came into his heart to visit his brethren the children of Israel.
- 24 And seeing one of them suffer wrong, he defended him, and avenged him that was oppressed, and smote the Egyptian:
- 25 For he supposed his brethren would have understood how that God by his hand would deliver them: but they understood not.
- 26 And the next day he shewed himself unto them as they strove, and would have set them at one again, saying, Sirs, ye are brethren; why do ye wrong one to another?
- 27 But he that did his neighbour wrong thrust him away, saying, Who made thee a ruler and a judge over us?
- 28 Wilt thou kill me, as thou diddest the Egyptian yesterday?
- Then fled Moses at this saying, and was a stranger in the land of Madian, where he begat two sons.
- 30 And when forty years were expired, there appeared to him in the wilderness of mount Sina an angel of the Lord in a flame of fire in a bush.
- 31 When Moses saw it, he wondered at the sight: and as he drew near to behold it, the voice of the Lord came unto him,

Acts 7:32-38: Hebrews 11:8-10

- 32 Saying, I am the God of thy fathers, the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Then Moses trembled, and durst not behold.
- 33 Then said the Lord to him, Put off thy shoes from thy feet: for the place where thou standest is holy ground.
- I have seen, I have seen the affliction of my people which is in Egypt, and I have heard their groaning, and am come down to deliver them. And now come, I will send thee into Egypt.
- 35 This Moses whom they refused, saying, Who made thee a ruler and a judge? the same did God send to be a ruler and a deliverer by the hand of the angel which appeared to him in the bush.
- 36 He brought them out, after that he had shewed wonders and signs in the land of Egypt, and in the Red sea, and in the wilderness forty years.
- 37 This is that Moses, which said unto the children of Israel, A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear.
- This is he, that was in the church in the wilderness with the angel which spake to him in the mount Sina, and with our fathers: who received the lively oracles to give unto us:
- 11:8 By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went
- 9 By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise:
- 10 For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God.

Hebrews 11:11-20

- 11 Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised.
- 12 Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, so many as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the sand which is by the sea shore innumerable.
- 13 These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of them, and embraced them, and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.
- 14 For they that say such things declare plainly that they seek a country.
- 15 And truly, if they had been mindful of that country from whence they came out, they might have had opportunity to have returned.
- 16 But now they desire a better country, that is, an heavenly: wherefore God is not ashamed to be called their God: for he hath prepared for them a city.
- 17 By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son,
- 18 Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called:
- 19 Accounting that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure.
- 20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come.

Hebrews 11:21-30

- 21 By faith Jacob, when he was a dying, blessed both the sons of Joseph; and worshipped, leaning upon the top of his staff.
- 22 By faith Joseph, when he died, made mention of the departing of the children of Israel; and gave commandment concerning his bones.
- 23 By faith Moses, when he was born, was hid three months of his parents, because they saw he was a proper child; and they were not afraid of the king's commandment.
- 24 By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;
- 25 Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;
- 26 Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.
- 27 By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.
- 28 Through faith he kept the passover, and the sprinkling of blood, lest he that destroyed the firstborn should touch them.
- 29 By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry land: which the Egyptians assaying to do were drowned.
- 30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.

Hebrews 11:31-40

31 By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.

- 32 And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gedeon, and of Barak, and of Samson, and of Jephthae; of David also, and Samuel, and of the prophets:
- 33 Who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions,
- 34 Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, waxed valiant in fight, turned to flight the armies of the aliens.
- 35 Women received their dead raised to life again: and others were tortured, not accepting deliverance; that they might obtain a better resurrection:
- 36 And others had trial of cruel mockings and scourgings, yea, moreover of bonds and imprisonment:
- 37 They were stoned, they were sawn asunder, were tempted, were slain with the sword: they wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins; being destitute, afflicted, tormented;
- 38 (Of whom the world was not worthy:) they wandered in deserts, and in mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth.
- 39 And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, received not the promise:
- 40 God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made perfect.
